

One Victoria enjoys a prime location just north of the city centre in the Victoria District. As well as putting renowned areas such as the Medieval Quarter, Central Retail District and Northern Quarter within walking distance, its transport connections mean all of Greater Manchester is easy to reach.







The development itself is set over two blocks, One East and One West. Fronting onto Great Ducie Street and rising up 14 floors, One East is the taller of the blocks, boasting 84 apartments. As well as offering expansive views across the city from the upper floors, it plays host to a 10th floor roof garden, which is accessible to all residents. One West is 10 storeys high, with 45 apartments and is accessed via Mirabel Street.

### 06–07 Manchester


Second only to London in terms of economic output and population size, Manchester is without question the capital of the north. It's also the UK's best city to live in according to The Economist magazine.

#### Restaurants

With over 650 venues, Manchester's food scene is as eclectic as you'd expect from such a diverse metropolis. A veritable world tour of culinary delights awaits your palette.

In terms of fine dining, the Michelin starred Mana leads the way. Adam Reid at The French, Tom Kerridge's Bull & Bear at Stock Exchange and 20 Stories are hot on its heels though.

Good food isn't about the size of the bill though, as venues such as Happy Seasons, Little Aladdin, Shoryu Ramen and Habesha ably demonstrate. Whatever you fancy and whatever your budget, you'll find yourself perfectly catered to.

#### Bars

From sleek and sophisticated cocktail bars to bustling, beat-filled venues, the city's nightlife is every bit as varied as its restaurant scene.

Cloud 23 combines the finest mixology with stunning views across the city. At the other end of the spectrum, there are an array of speakeasy-style bars, such as The Pen and Pencil, Arcane and Science & Industry.

There are plenty of traditional pubs dotted about the city too. For all Manchester's modernity, it has definitely not forgotten its past.




### 16–17 Local Area

#### Retail

With its roots in the cotton industry, Manchester has always been a city at forefront of fashion. Today, the Northern Quarter arguably leads the way for the city's fashion scene due to its host of trendy independent stores, including Afflecks, Junk Shop and Oi Polloi.

The Royal Exchange, King Street, Spinningfields, New Cathedral Street, Selfridges and Harvey Nichols cater to the designer end of the market. While the Manchester Arndale has all the high street favourites you could ask for.

Slightly further afield, but readily accessible by tram are Quayside MediaCityUK (25 mins) and The Trafford Centre (36 mins). Rest assured, your wardrobe will be every bit as impressive as your home.



#### Culture

The birthplace of Oasis, New Order, The Smiths and the Hacienda, music is part of the fabric of Manchester. An array of venues offering everything from chart-topping artists to classical symphonies and the next big things are dotted though out the city. In fact the AO Arena is right on your doorstep.

There are plenty of museums, galleries and theatres to explore too. The true passion of Manchester is of course football however. The city is split in terms of its allegiances, but whether you're United or City for life, rest assured Old Trafford and The Etihad Stadium are both readily accessible. You're also moments from the National Football Museum.

### Well-being



Cathedral Gardens or Angel Meadow Park are great spots to unwind with friends or a book. While the much anticipated City River Park, will add another 35,000 sqm of new and improved park and woodland to the city by 2024, as part of redevelopment plans for Red Bank.

As the birthplace of the industrial revolution, Manchester's been an economic powerhouse since 1760. It's just today cotton has been replaced by Al, data, cyber, construction tech, e-commerce, media, medtech and countless other dynamic sectors.

Manchester is the largest UK city region economy outside of London, with a GVA of £71bn. Not to mention, a leading European business destination and the most successful UK city for attracting foreign direct investment after the capital.

Success, of course, breeds success. In recent years, a who's who of well-known businesses and organisations have decided to call Manchester home – the BBC, BUPA, Freshfields, Siemens, ITV, Google, Amazon and Kellogg's – and many more are joining them, strengthening the city's status in the UK and globally.

A great place to study and to start a career, Greater Manchester boasts five higher education institutions and one of the largest student populations in Europe.

Some 99,000 people, including 41,000 international students study across the city. Even more impressive is the fact over 50% of the city's students stay in Manchester on graduation. A better validation of both the quality of life and the career prospects Manchester has to offer would be hard to find.

N > UNIVERSITY OF MANCHESTER: With a history of world firsts, ranging from splitting the atom to giving the world graphene, the university boasts 25 Nobel Prize winners among its alumni.

One Victoria is an ideal base from which to explore Manchester, the UK and in fact, the world. While so much of the city centre is within walking distance, conveniently the development is also superbly served by Manchester's public transport network.



A three-minute walk away, Manchester Victoria station is the nearest Metrolink tram stop, putting five lines – and all of Manchester – at your disposal. The city's second biggest station and a gateway to the north, it also offers rail services to an array of cities, including Leeds, Newcastle and Liverpool.


Manchester Piccadilly, the city's main rail hub is also readily accessible being just 12 minutes by tram from Victoria station. From there, you can access intercity train services to London, Birmingham, Bristol, Edinburgh and other locations across the UK. When HS2 arrives here, many of these journey times will be significantly reduced, with the time taken to travel to London almost being halved.

For trips to more far-flung destinations, Manchester Airport is just over 25 minutes by train from Manchester Victoria station. From Hong Kong, Singapore and Beijing to New York, Dubai and countless European destinations, the whole world is waiting to be explored.

MANCHESTER VICTORIA: Just a three-minute walk from One Victoria, Manchester Victoria connects you to all of Greater Manchester, the airport and an array of other cities.



















A tranquil escape high above Manchester's bustling streets, the 10th floor roof garden is an oasis that's open to all One Victoria's residents.
